Below is a fun and easy volunteer activity you are able to do at home while practicing social distancing.



## Diaper Bundling

Each month we distribute over 4,000 diapers through the Rainbow Room. For inventory purposes we distribute 8 bundles of 6 diapers per child, per visit to the room. If you would like to help keep our baskets stocked, you can bundle diapers at home and schedule a pick up or drop off time with PFC staff.

### Supplies needed:

- Rubber Bands
- Gloves
- Box of Diapers (we are completely out of pull ups, both genders and all size of pull ups are needed)

### Steps to bundle:

1. Please put on gloves before beginning. Your safety and that of our families is our first priority.
2. Open up your box of diapers. I recommend opening the package on the side without the sticky tabs that close the diapers. (It is easier to count from that side of the package)
3. Count out 6 diapers and place a rubber band around them. If you end up with an extra diaper or two, you can add them to a bundle, no biggie if one has an extra.
4. Once you have completed the package, place the bundles in the box. It's that easy!

\*\*\*Please note, diapers should be bundled by size, pull-ups by size and gender\*\*\*
